Confidential Advisors

Students may choose to consult with a confidential advisor. Confidential advisors are specifically trained to provide support to survivors of sexual violence or those who know a survivor. They are available to answer questions, provide information, and help navigate options available at DeVry as well as in the community. They can fulfill their reporting requirements by making general reports for statistical purposes and pattern tracking but do not divulge personally identifiable information. Communication with the confidential advisor is confidential in all circumstances, except when imminent risk of serious physical injury or death of the victim or another person could result or where reporting is required under federal, state or local law.

Code of Conduct

The following information supplements the Student Code of Conduct procedures, which is covered in its entirety in the Student Handbook.

Article IV: Conduct Procedures

Charges and Hearings

- Both the reporting and responding party have the right to appeal the complaint resolution procedure's findings or imposed sanctions if either party alleges:
 - 1. a procedural error occurred,
 - 2. new information exists that would substantially change the outcome of the finding, or
 - 3. the sanction is disproportionate with the violation.
- If either party appeals, the other party will be informed of the appeal. Both parties will receive the appeal decision in writing within seven days after the conclusion of the appeal review.
