

FAQ's: Prospective Students

Q: How can I get more information on the types of programs offered at DeVry University or its Keller Graduate School of Management?

A: Complete the "Request More Information" form. To do this, return to the site and select the "Request More Information" option from the left-hand menu. When you have successfully submitted the form, you will see a confirmation screen ensuring your submission was successful. Following this, you can expect to hear from one of our advisors.

Q: What do I need to do to start talking to an admissions advisor?

A: Complete the "Request More Information" form on your company's partner page. To do this, return to the site and select the "Request More Information" option from the left-hand menu. When you have successfully submitted the form, you will see a confirmation screen ensuring your submission was successful. Following this, you can expect to hear from one of our advisors within a few business days.

Q: What information will an admissions advisor be able to provide?

A: One of DeVry University or Keller Graduate School of Management's admissions advisors can provide you with:

- More detailed information on the degree programs offered
 - Admissions Requirements
 - Average time of program completion for full-time students
 - Details about On-Site, Online, and Mix & Match learning
 - Details about blended learning
 - Tuition cost, per credit hour
 - Start dates & university schedule
 - Steps to apply and enroll, if interested
 - Information on transcript evaluation process and transferring qualifying credits (after the application process has been completed)

Q: When can I start classes?

A: DeVry University and Keller Graduate School of Management operate on a flexible three-semester-per-year academic calendar that allows you to complete your degree program on an accelerated schedule. Classes run for a period of 8 weeks, with two 8-week sessions per semester. Year-round classes mean you can earn an associate degree in just over one year (or as few as four semesters) or a bachelor's degree in as few as three years (or as few as nine semesters). At Keller Graduate School of Management, you have the opportunity to earn a master's degree in as few as one and a half years after you earn your bachelor's degree.

Q: Can I receive the benefits of the Educational Alliance between DeVry and my company, as well as scholarships and/or other program benefits (such as Military/Veteran programs)?

A: A student may participate in one DeVry-based scholarship or tuition benefit program only. Students who qualify for more than one program will be presumed to accept the program with the highest reduction in by-semester cost. Students who qualify for and prefer a different scholarship or tuition benefit program must confirm, in writing, the alternate program in which they wish to participate prior to starting classes at DeVry.

Q: Can I transfer credits from another institution?

A: At DeVry University, we want to ensure you get the credit you deserve. An applicant seeking to transfer credit from another institution must request a credit evaluation prior to beginning the first class at DeVry and must provide an official transcript from the institution where the credit was earned. DeVry may require a catalog or additional material or, if credits were earned at a foreign institution, a credit evaluation by an approved external evaluation service. A maximum of 80 DeVry qualifying credit hours may be awarded for lower-division or community college courses, subject to DeVry's residence requirement for the chosen program. Q: Can I receive college credit for real-world experience?

A: DeVry does not grant academic credit for life experience. Approved nationally recognized tests (AP, CLEP, DANTES/DSST) may be recognized for proficiency credit. You may transfer qualifications CLEP and DANTES/DSST examinations to fulfill credit and or course requirements. Credits transfers will be dependent upon your individual requirements. An admissions advisor can provide you with more information on testing specifics.

Q: How long does the enrollment process take?

A: The time it takes to enroll may vary. However, DeVry University and its Keller Graduate School of Management offer six (6) session starts per year, so it is likely that you will be able to begin taking classes in a timely manner.

Q: How long does it take to complete a degree program at DeVry University?

A: Year-round classes mean you can earn an associate degree from DeVry University in just over one year (or as few as four semesters) or a bachelor's degree from DeVry University in as few as three years (or as few as nine semesters). At Keller Graduate School of Management, you have the opportunity to earn a master's degree in less than a year and a half after you obtain your bachelor's degree.
