To qualify, you must have completed your qualifying degree within 10 years of your date of application to Keller and must have graduated with a cumulative grade point average of 3.00 or higher. All requests for course waivers ${ }^{1}$ are considered on an individual basis.

## Course Waivers - Keller's Graduate Technology Degree Programs

> Students with bachelor's degrees in technology may be granted waivers for up to 5 courses totaling 15 semester-credit hours, depending on their program of study. Students in Keller's master's degree programs in Information Systems Management (MISM). Information Technology Management (MITM) and Network \& Communications Management (MNCM) who are awarded these waivers have just 10 courses ( 30 semester-credit hours) remaining to complete their programs.
