



In accordance with the Higher Education Act (HEA) of 1965, as amended, each postsecondary educational institution must make available information regarding the types of graduate and professional education in which graduates of the institution's four-year degree programs enrolled.

Approximately 3.5% of students who completed a DeVry University bachelor's degree program between July 1st, 2017, and June 30th, 2022, went on to enroll in a graduate or professional program. The most common programs students enrolled in, listed by Classification of Instructional Code^{*} title, are as follows:

- Business Administration and Management
- Computer Information Systems Security/Auditing/Information Assurance
- Health Information/Medical Records Technology/Technician
- Accounting and Finance
- Public Administration
- Information Technology

The data is derived from the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) Completions Survey for the FY2018, FY2019, FY2020, FY2021, and FY2022 reporting periods and the National Student Clearinghouse Student Tracker to identify enrollment in graduate programs as of February 17, 2023.
