**Student Loan Information**

Definitions

***Bold, italicized font is included below to indicate where the information DeVry University collected differs from the information required by BPPE.***

<sup>1</sup> “Number of Students Who Began Program” means the number of students who began the program who are scheduled to complete the program within the reporting calendar year, and includes all the students who remained enrolled after their cancellation period.

***DeVry University measures on-time completion to be the amount of time needed to complete each program if the student attends on a full-time basis. Because of this, for the purposes of this fact sheet, those who entered part-time are not included.***

<sup>2</sup> “Students available for graduation” is the number of students who began program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.

<sup>3</sup> “Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the program length.

***DeVry University measures on-time completion to be the amount of time needed to complete each program if the student attends on a full-time basis. Because of this, for the purposes of this fact sheet, those who entered part-time are not included.***

<sup>4</sup> “Completion Rate” is the number of Graduates divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation.

<sup>5</sup> “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed within 101-150% of the program length.

***DeVry University measures 150% completion based on 150% of the expected completion time for a full-time student. Because of this, for the purposes of this fact sheet, those who entered part-time are not included.***

<sup>6</sup> “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 101-150% of the published program length divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation in the published program length period.

<sup>7</sup> “Graduates available for employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment. “Graduates unavailable for employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

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“Graduates employed in the field” means graduates who are gainfully employed in a single position for which the institution represents the program prepares its graduates within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the period of employment must begin within six months of the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.

***DeVry University data for “Graduates employed in the field” includes all graduates who obtained employment in their field of study (considering all of the graduates’ jobs), as determined by the institution, between 120 days prior to graduation and 180 days after graduation. DeVry University considers graduates who work fewer than 35 hours per week to be employed part-time. For the purposes of this fact sheet, their employment outcomes are included in the category: “Graduates Employed in the Field an average of less than 32 hours per week”. “Graduates Employed in Field” does not reflect the employment outcomes of:***

- ***those who entered part-time, even if they graduated***
- ***full-time students who completed the program outside of the normal full-time program length (for example, more than 2 years for a 2-year associate degree program and more than 4 years for a 4-year bachelor’s degree program);***
- ***graduates whose employment in their field of study began more than 120 days prior to or six months after graduation.***

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“Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

Number of Students Taking Exam is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the published program length and who took the exam in the reported calendar year for the first time.

Exam Date is the date for the first available exam after the students completed the program.

Passage Rate is calculated by dividing the number of students who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.

Number Who Passed First Exam Taken is the number of students who took and passed the licensing exam in the reported calendar year on the first attempt.
