Please follow the process outlined below to determine if courses you have taken through “The Institutes” may qualify for DeVry University college credit:

1. Apply for admission to DeVry University and work with your Admissions Advisor to request evaluation of The Institutes training. Existing DeVry students should request the evaluation through their Academic or Student Services Advisor.
3. Please reference the below matrix for a list of courses that carry an ACE recommendation that are eligible for transfer to DeVry University.
4. An ACE transcript must be requested and submitted to DeVry in order for evaluation of courses to take place. ACE transcripts can be requested via the following link: [ACE Transcript Service](#)
5. Evaluation results will be disseminated to you via your Admissions or Academic Advisor.
6. Register for classes according to your plan of study.

Undergraduate: An applicant seeking to transfer credit from another institution must request a credit evaluation prior to beginning the first class at DeVry University and must provide an official transcript from the institution where the credit was earned. A maximum of 80 DeVry credit hours may be awarded for lower-division or community college courses. To graduate, students must earn at least 25 percent of their programs' required credit hours or a minimum of 30 semester-credit hours, whichever is greater, through coursework completed at DeVry University. Higher program-specific requirements may be imposed for internal or external transfer students.
