

## Student Right-to-Know Disclosures: 2020 Graduation Rates by Campus Location

The cohort consists of all full-time degree-seeking students entering college for the first time in fall 2014, minus qualifying exclusions. The graduation rate is the percent of the cohort graduating within 150% of program length.
