2024 DeVry University Sexual Misconduct Campus Climate Survey

Introduction and Background:

DeVry University's (DeVry) community, guests and visitors have the right to be free from all forms of sex and gender-based misconduct, discrimination and retaliation, examples of which can include acts of sexual harassment, sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, and stalking. In September 2024, DeVry conducted the Sexual Misconduct Campus Climate Survey. This was an anonymous survey designed to seek information about personal experiences of sexual misconduct and perceptions of DeVry's actions to prevent and/or respond to reports of sexual discriminations.

Survey Background:

Public Act 102-0325 (110 ILCS 155/35) mandates that all Illinois institutions of higher education conduct an annual campus sexual misconduct climate survey. The survey's purpose was to collect information about the behaviors and perceptions that current students have on relationships, sexual experiences, experiences with dating violence, and perceptions about safety at a university. The law called for the creation of a Task Force which was charged with creating a "base survey," to gather information on areas outlined in the statute:

- Reported and unreported incidents of sexual misconduct
- Student awareness of institutions' sexual misconduct policies and procedures.
- Whether students were provided information on their rights and/or referred to victim support services .
- Student demographic information to help identify at-risk groups.
- The perceptions of campus safety and confidence in the higher education institution's ability to protect students against sexual misconduct.
- Contextual factors of a sexual misconduct incident and any student academic outcomes, such as withdrawing from classes or being placed on academic probation.

This survey used the instrument created by the Task Force and may be the baseline for future annual surveys.

Survey Administration:

DeVry University administered the online survey to students on September 17, 2024 and closed the survey on October 29, 2024. On October 8, 2024, a DeVry issued a reminder email was sent to all students. The survey was sent to all students residing in Illinois and enrolled in either an online program or a location in Illinois. A total of 3,565 students were sent a link to complete the survey.

The survey responses were anonymous. No personally identifiable information was collected in the survey. During the introduction of the survey, students were presented with the required informed consent that included notifying participants that the survey was voluntary and that they could skip any questions.

The base survey contained seven questions that were modifiable by the institution. Below are the questions that were modifiable to institutions and the modifications that DeVry made.

- Question 4: No modification.
- Question 5: Added "2024" as an option.
- Question 7: Removed "fraternity or sorority (pledge or member)", "intercollegiate athletic team" and "intramural or club athletic team" as options as these are not offered at DeVry. Modified "Other student organization or group" to "Student organization, club or group". Added "GetSet" and "I have not been a member of any group or DeVry community" as options.
- Question 9: Removed "On campus residence hall/dormitory", "Other on campus housing (apartment, house)", "Fraternity or sorority house", "Off campus institution sponsored apartment/house" and "Off campus housing non-institution sponsored" as DeVry does not offer housing for students. Modified "Other" to "Off-campus".
- Question 18: Added StudentLinc as an option with a description.
- Question 87: Removed "Attended an event or program about what you can do as a bystander to stop sexual misconduct", "Attended a rally or other campus event about sexual misconduct or sexual assault", "Seen or heard about sexual misconduct in a student publication or media outlet" and "Taken a class to learn more about sexual misconduct". Added "Completed an online training about sexual misconduct or sexual harassment" and "Reviewed DeVry's Title IX and Sexual Misconduct Policy" as options. Replaced "Institution" with DeVry University.
- Question 88: Removed "or honor code" on option 7.

Additionally, DeVry added two questions to the initial demographics section:

- Are you currently a graduate or undergraduate student?
 - Undergraduate
 - Graduate
 - Prefer not to respond
- What state do you reside in?
 - This included a drop down listing each state
