Articulation Agreement with DeVry University

The Turks & Caicos Islands Community College (“Institution”) Government-Tertiary Education organized under the laws of Turks & Caicos Islands and DeVry University, Inc. (“DeVry”), an Illinois corporation, have entered into this Articulation Agreement (“Agreement”) for the application of prior learning credit to benefit those Eligible Individuals as defined below who wish to matriculate to pursue a credential at DeVry.

Articulation Agreement

The Institution and DeVry agree to the following:

- The Institution and DeVry will draft and maintain Course Transfer Guides outlined in Appendix A.
- Eligible Individuals are students or coursetakers at Institution who meet DeVry’s admission and other student requirements.
- Under this Agreement, students from the Institution are subject to the terms of DeVry’s admissions requirements, academic policies, program requirements, and course descriptions, as amended from time to time, including but not limited to those included in the DeVry Academic Catalogs. Students from the Institution will not be denied admission to DeVry on the basis of any admissions test score. Students admitted under this Agreement may be tested for placement purposes. Certain programs have separate requirements for assessment and placement. The score obtained on such placement tests may result in the need for the student to successfully complete appropriate transitional studies coursework, which may affect program length and cost.
- Under this Agreement, students who completed one or more courses at the Institution satisfy DeVry’s English-language-proficiency requirement.
- Under this Agreement, DeVry reserves the right to deny admission to a student if such student cannot meet DeVry’s requirements for admission, as amended from time to time. Additionally, DeVry may terminate a student’s enrollment for violation of any rule, policy or procedure of DeVry, as amended from time to time, in the same manner as DeVry may terminate the enrollment of any student at large. Causes for termination of the student’s enrollment include, but are not limited to, the student’s failure to make timely payments of tuition and/or related fees.
- The minimum required grade for transfer credit is a grade of “C” (70%) for undergraduate students or a grade of “B” (80%) for graduate students. Transfer credit is applicable to those courses that are required in the chosen program of study. Proficiency credit may be applied for courses that are not offered by a college and carry ACE credit recommendations. Minimum grade or other requirements to determine applicability of proficiency credit are defined by DeVry’s evaluation of ACE credit recommendations or similar evaluation of the Institution’s academic materials.
- To graduate, all students must meet the residency requirement for their academic program as noted in the Academic Catalog. In addition, undergraduate students must meet upper-division course requirements for their chosen DeVry program. DeVry, with approval of the Provost, may waive the residency requirement where applicable.
- DeVry will waive application fees for each Eligible Individual.

Confidentiality

Any information shared between the parties, which by their nature should be reasonably understood by the receiving party as confidential or proprietary information, shall remain confidential.

Appendices

Any Appendix referenced in this Agreement is hereby incorporated herein by reference. In the event of any conflict between the terms of body of this Agreement and the terms of any Appendix, the terms of the body of this Agreement shall prevail.

Marketing

The Institution and DeVry will work together to promote this Agreement to the Institution’s student population, which may include on-site events and distribution of marketing materials. Any written materials published and distributed that reference this Agreement or a relationship between the Institution and DeVry must be approved in advance by each respective party. The parties may utilize each other’s trademarks in connection with promoting the Agreement, provided the other party pre-approves such use; neither party shall gain any right, title or interest in any name or trademark of the other party.



Additional Terms

In the event that a student elects to enroll and attend both DeVry and Institution simultaneously, students will be responsible for those costs and expenses related to their studies at each academic institution. These costs are stated in the current catalog in effect at each academic institution. This Agreement does not entail economic responsibility on the part of the respective participating academic institutions. In addition, each academic institution will be responsible for the disbursement of the financial aid pertaining to the students who are eligible during the period of time that they are enrolled in the respective academic institution. Also, each academic institution will implement any procedures required to achieve satisfactory academic progress. Each will also maintain student records and, if applicable, will comply with the federal regulations governing the use of Title IV funds.

No financial implications concerns the transfer or exchange of cash, equipment, or real estate are intended or implied by this Agreement. The Institution and DeVry are separate and independent institutions of higher education and nothing contained herein shall be construed in any manner to constitute a partnership, teach-out agreement, or other similar relationship between the parties.

Disclaimer, Limitation and Indemnification

DeVry warrants that it shall maintain all accreditations and licenses required to perform its obligations under this Agreement and shall provide its services in a professional and workmanlike manner consistent with standards customary in the higher education sector. Except for the foregoing express warranty, each party disclaims all other warranties, whether express, implied, statutory, or otherwise, including any implied warranties of merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, either party's aggregate liability arising out of or relating to this Agreement, whether in contract, tort, strict liability or otherwise, shall not exceed One Thousand United States Dollars (\$1,000). In no event shall either party be liable for any indirect, consequential, incidental, special or punitive damages of any kind.

Each party (the "Indemnifying Party") shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the other party and its officers, directors, and employees (the "Indemnified Party") from and against any and all third-party claims, losses, damages, liabilities, costs, and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) to the extent arising from: (i) any material breach of this Agreement by the Indemnifying Party; or (ii) any negligent act or omission, recklessness, or willful misconduct of the Indemnifying Party in connection with the performance of its obligations under this Agreement.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Indemnifying Party's obligations under this Clause shall be reduced to the extent that the Indemnified Party's own negligence, recklessness, or willful misconduct caused or contributed to the relevant claim or loss.

The terms of this entire Section shall survive termination of this Agreement for any reason.

Term, Termination and Modification

This Agreement is effective upon the date of the last signature and shall remain in effect for one year. Thereafter, this Agreement shall automatically renew for additional one-year term(s) until **March 24, 2031**, or until terminated by either party upon providing thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party, whichever is sooner. In addition, either party may terminate this Agreement for any reason, or no reason, by providing ten (10) days written notice to the other party. In the event of a termination of this Agreement, each party will be responsible for amending any publications or websites as needed and for disposing of any brochures or related materials. This Agreement is subject to change or modification by mutual written consent between the parties. Any provisions of this Agreement, which remain to be performed, or by their nature would be intended to be applicable following the expiration or termination of this Agreement shall survive the expiration/termination of this Agreement.

Notices may be sent by email to the address provided below. Notices requiring confirmation of receipt will be considered acknowledged by email reply. If a reply is not received within 5 business days, then a mailed notice will be provided. Any mailed notice provided for or permitted under this Agreement shall be treated as having been given the next business day after being sent by nationally recognized commercial overnight courier or three business days after being postage prepaid by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, to the party to be notified or upon receipt if delivered in person. Notices will be sent to the addresses set forth in this Agreement or such other address as may be provided from time to time.
